

What is it all about?

- 1. The Cumbria Youth Climate Change Summit 2019 is all about student voice. It is an opportunity to hear what young people are concerned about, and what they think businesses, local councils and national government should be doing.
- We expect media attention and will be making our own video of the event. Please ensure students have parental permission to be interviewed, videoed and photographed (see form to be completed and brought along on the day).
- 3. We have not heard back from DEFRA as yet, our pupils having written to Michael Gove (see right, sent to correspondence.section@def ra.gov.uk) inviting him to attend and hear what the young people have to say.
- 4. We hope to have local council representatives attending to hear the young people's views.
- 5. We will also be joined by Hazel Graham, Chief Executive of Cumbria Action for Sustainability. Hazel is looking forward to hearing the young people's views and will give a response.



Dear Mr Gove,

I am writing to you regarding: climate change. Anyone can tell that the weather is getting stranger by the day and it is affecting us all. I hope you realise this!

Climate change is an increased level of atmospheric carbon dioxide produced by fossil fuels. Unfortunately, climate change (global warming) also affects animals. This summit is an opportunity for Cumbria's youth to join together collectively and share their thoughts about a range of environmental issues, including: global warming, renewable energy, fossil fuels, fracking, deforestation, loss of biodiversity, recycling, pollution, single use plastic.

The University of Cumbria is providing a venue for the summit at Fusehill Street Campus in Carlisle. We are inviting 40 schools (infant, junior, primary, special schools or secondary) from across Cumbria. Each school will have two minutes to present their concerns about climate change from pupils at their school. The tickets are free available on Eventbrite.co.uk
