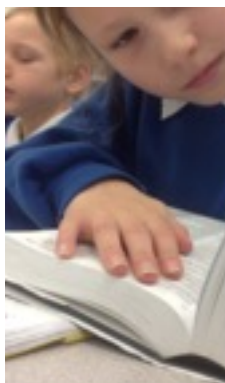

Garden Design Project

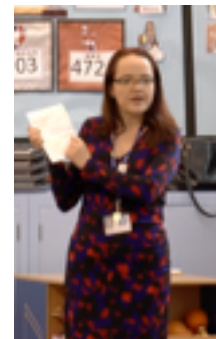
School council have been working with a landscape architect and consulting with pupils throughout school to design a complete re-landscaping of our school garden.
